Membership Funded Pacific Triple Elimination Project

The ASHM Membership Funded Triple Elimination Project aims to reduce mother to child transmission of HIV, viral hepatitis and syphilis in Timor-Leste and Papua New Guinea.

HIV, hepatitis B and syphilis can be transmitted from mothers to their infants in pregnancy, during labour, and via breastfeeding. However, transmission of these infections can be prevented by simple and effective early interventions.

The triple elimination project will work with partners to help strengthen universal testing and treatment in antenatal care for pregnant women and their partners initially in Timor-Leste and Papua New Guinea. While also focusing on stigma reduction within antenatal care and increasing the health literacy of pregnant women and their partners, to improve access to HIV, syphilis and Hepatitis B testing and treatment.

Nursing Ordinary Membership \$110	One of our most popular membership categories. For nursing and midwifery professionals located within Australia and New Zealand - with a professional interest in HIV, viral hepatitis, sexual and reproductive health, or any other related conditions.
Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander Ordinary Membership \$110	For Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander health professionals located within Australia and New Zealand - with a professional interest in HIV, viral hepatitis, sexual and reproductive health, or any other related conditions.


Honorary Life Membership
