

NSW Hepatitis B in Primary Care

Target audience: General Practitioners, primary care Nurses, and other interested primary care providers working with patients at risk of or living with hepatitis B based in NSW.

In 2022, an estimated 205, 549 people were living with chronic hepatitis B (CHB) in Australia, with 27.9% undiagnosed and 74.5% were not engaged in regular care (Viral Hepatitis Mapping Project: Hepatitis B, National Report 2022).

Guideline-based management and treatment of CHB can prevent liver cancer, with CHB being the primary cause of liver cancer worldwide. Primary care practitioners play a critical role in the diagnosis and management of CHB in the community, and in reducing preventable deaths from liver cancer.

Presented by **Dr Nada Andric**, a General Practitioner at The Haymarket Foundation, Chippendale, this webinar will provide participants with crucial knowledge and understanding of hepatitis B. Topics covered include epidemiology, transmission, testing, monitoring, and management.
