Description:

This free training course provides nurses, midwives and AOD workers with the knowledge and confidence to increase screening and management of hepatitis C in primary care settings.

Target Audience:

This training is for nurses and midwives working across varied service settings in NSW, including general practice and other primary care settings, hospital settings, Correctional settings, Drug and Alcohol services, Sexual/reproductive health services and Aboriginal Community-Controlled Health Organisations. AOD counsellors, Aboriginal Health Workers, other health workers involved in hepatitis C assessment and work-up of patients are also encouraged to attend. Registration is open to health workers in all states and territories.
