## ONLINE COURSE PROGRAM – Hepatitis B for Nurses and Midwives

This education program is conducted in 3 parts:

### Part 1: Pre-course activities

Participants should complete the required pre-course activities prior to attending the facilitated training. This should take approximately 2.25 hours to complete required content. Pre-course activities list:

### Part 2: Facilitated training

The facilitated component will be comprised of 2 x 2-hour webinars consisting of presentations, polling, and group discussions.

The webinar sessions will be run on the following dates:

1. Tuesday 17<sup>th</sup> June 2025, 6:30pm-8:30pm AEST – Lived experience perspectives, epidemiology, culturally safe care, transmission, vaccination and prevention, testing and serology and initial assessment
2. Thursday 19<sup>th</sup> June 2025, 6:30pm-8:30pm AEST– Hepatitis B ongoing monitoring, treatment and linkage to care, HCC surveillance and case studies

### Part 3: Post-course activities
